The Lord bless you from on high and continue to make you a blessing both to the school and to this, His Christian congregation.

May He grant that you may gladly learn from their instructions, especially as they teach the Word of God. Do not resist the discipline they impose in God's name, so that their work may be an everlasting blessing to you, and that the Good Shepherd's promise for His lambs be fulfilled in you. His promise is to His lambs and His sheep as He says, "I give unto them eternal life." Amen.
