



## Come and See!

Considering a Message from John 1:43-51  
For the Week of July 21st, 2019

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*The 5th Sunday after Trinity focuses us on “Discipleship.” On this Sunday, we hear about the privileges and joys of following Christ; but we are also given encouragement for the times when we, as Jesus’ disciples, face challenges and hostilities from our spiritual enemies. What comfort we have as our Lord reassures us that He will strengthen us and be with us every step of the way. As we go out, it is not our own efforts or work, but His work that is carried out through us, that grows His kingdom. After all, the Lord is the one who sends out “many fishermen” and “many hunters” to bring His people back to Him. (Jeremiah 16:14-21) It is the Lord who gives “the hope that is in you”—that which motivates us to “always be prepared to give an answer” to those who see and ask about our faith. (1 Peter 3:8-15) As Jesus began His public ministry he called upon Philip to “Follow Me.” Philip happily did this by sharing the news about Jesus with Nathanael. When Nathanael responded with skepticism, Philip simply said: “Come and See!” Jesus then took it from there. He demonstrated to Nathanael that He was indeed the Promised One and He promised Nathanael that they would witness great things when following Him. This is a promise that applies still to those who follow Jesus—who continue in “discipleship.” We too listen to that gracious invitation and we share it with others: “Come and See!” “We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus!”*

**Opening Prayer:** We thank You Lord Jesus for the gracious invitation you give to “Come and see YOU.” We thank You for calling us to be Your disciples and for working through us to invite more people to “Come and see!” Be with us now as we gather to discuss Your Word. Strengthen our faith and trust in You. Help us to be Your disciples. We pray this in Your name. Amen.

### CONNECT to Each Other

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For this first session, take a few moments to get to know each other better—especially anyone who might be new or unfamiliar to the people in your group. Have each person briefly introduce themselves with: first/last name, immediate family, where you work(ed), how long you’ve been a member of Mt. Olive, and one thing you like to help others remember you: *“I’m the guy or gal who likes to...”*

1. (Icebreaker:) Has there ever been a certain event you had to be persuaded into attending—that later on you were grateful for? Or has there been a certain product, or place of business, or website that you were initially skeptical about, that someone convinced you to check out—that you came to appreciate and find useful? Explain....

### CONNECT to the Word—*Read the Bible text together (also consider its context): John 1:43-51*

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2. In John 1:46, Philip told his friend Nathanael, “Come and see!” What are some ways a church might seek to make that same invitation to people who don’t know Jesus?

3. There are many different strategies that churches employ for outreach and evangelism. These strategies meet with varying success in various places. Finally, what alone can draw an unbeliever to Jesus? What is it that brings out Nathanael's profession that Jesus is "the Son of God!"?



4. Why must this power to bring people to faith—to make disciples—be God's, and not our own? Why is this comforting for us to consider? How might this also be a frustrating thing for us?

5. Why does "seeing Jesus rightly" also mean "seeing ourselves rightly"?

6. When we "see" Jesus, we see our true and only Savior. What does the Bible say that Jesus did for us?

7. What did Jesus mean when He told Nathanael, "You will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man"?

## CONNECT to Life

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8. How does Jesus' promise to Nathanael about seeing "greater things"—also apply to us? Where do we get to see "Heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man"?

9. How did the hymns, other lessons, parts of the service, etc. fit together with the Sermon message and overall theme for the day?
