Explanation of the Week: *In this Advent season we ready our hearts for the Kingdom of God to come. However, it is important for us to realize that this "Kingdom of God" is already here, "among us" - "within us" (Luke 17:20-21). It is here because Jesus is with us through His Word and Sacraments. His presence with us now ensures us that we will be present with Him in eternity. His presence with us now also gives us comfort and healing as we face trouble in this life. We rejoice in His presence, and through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures (Romans 15:4-13), we are strengthened in our hope by the Holy Spirit, and we watch diligently for Jesus' next, and final, coming. On that coming day, we will join people of many nations going up to the mountain of the Lord, enjoying the peace that our Lord provides (Micah 4:1-7).*

P: Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of our Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. May He comfort your heart by His holy Absolution, and strengthen you by His Sacraments, that your joy may be full. Peace be with You!

~Old Testament Lesson

(EHV)

Micah 4:1-7 In the last days, the mountain of the House of the Lord will be established as the highest among the mountains. It will be raised above the hills, and peoples will stream to it like a river. Many nations will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the Mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob. He will teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths." The law will go out from Zion and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He will render judgment between many peoples. He will settle disputes between mighty nations from far away. They will pound their swords into plowshares and their spears into blades for trimming vines. Nation will not raise the sword against nation, and they will not learn how to wage war any longer. Each man will sit under his own vine and under his own fig tree. There will be no one to make them afraid, for the mouth of the Lord of Armies has spoken. For all the other peoples walk in the names of their gods, but we will walk in the name of the Lord our God forever and ever. On that day, says the Lord, I will bring in the lame and gather the scattered, even those I have afflicted. I will establish the lame as survivors and the scattered as a powerful nation. The Lord will rule over them on Mount Zion from that time on and forever.

(EHV)

Romans 15:4-13 Indeed, whatever was written in the past was written for our instruction, so that, through patient endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures, we would have hope. And may God, the source of patient endurance and encouragement, grant that you agree with one another in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that with one mind, in one voice, you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. For this reason, accept one another as Christ also accepted you to the glory of God. For I am saying that Christ became a servant of those who are circumcised for the sake of God's truth, to confirm the promises made to the patriarchs. He also did this so that the Gentiles would glorify God for his mercy, as it is written: For this reason I will praise you among the Gentiles, and I will sing to your name. III. The Service of Holy Communion



(Following Christ's command, we receive His grace to us in the special meal He instituted for the forgiveness of our sins. Here, He feeds with His true body and His true blood in, with, and under the bread and wine. This is the same body which was born of the Virgin Mary, and the same blood which dripped down the wooden cross. This part of the liturgy is one of the oldest parts, dating back to at least the third century AD.

Questions and prayers to assist in preparing for the Lord's Supper are found in the black hymnal pp. 38–40.)

- **Guests & Visitors:** *We practice “Close” or “Closed Communion” (or “Membership Communion”). We do this out of love and concern for you. We want to make sure that those who take this holy meal receive it as a blessing and not to their harm as Scripture warns. We also understand that those who come forward to take communion are professing a unity of faith with our congregation and are in full agreement with the teachings and doctrines of Mount Olive Lutheran Church and of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod. Therefore, we ask those who have not taken Holy Communion with us before to speak with a pastor before communing. Thank you.*

Line of Credit (LOC) Challenge Update

A few weeks ago, the Line of Credit Challenge was issued to the congregation to raise \$20,000 by December 15 (Phase 1) that would be matched by an anonymous donor. This donor also challenged the congregation to raise another \$20,000 between January 1 to June 15, 2023 (Phase 2) that would also be matched by this donor. By God's grace, as of December 1, we have received \$25,542.12! Because of your generosity, we paid off \$40,000 on our Line of Credit over the past few days! Thanks to all who gave offerings to Phase I—praise be to God for such a quick and wonderful outpouring of Christian love!! Please wait until January 1, 2023, to begin donating to Phase 2 so that your gifts will count towards the \$20,000 needed for the match. Please be aware that funds received above the \$20,000 for Phase 1 will not count towards Phase 2.
