Welcome! In the name of our risen Savior we welcome you to Mt. Olive and thank you for worshipping with us. Explanation of the Week: Our Lord wept over Jerusalem for the destruction that would soon come upon her. For she did not recognize the time of God's visitation in Christ, who had come to bring her peace (Luke 19:41-48). Through His prophets God had consistently called His people to turn from their deceit and false worship. "But My people do not know the judgment of the Lord" (Jer 7:1-11; 8:4-12). They sought to establish their own righteousness rather than receive Christ's righteousness through faith (Rom 9:30-10:4 God grant us to know the things that make for our peace by His visitation in the Word and Sacraments so that by the Holy Spirit we may penitently confess "Jesus is Lord" (1 Cor 12:1-11).

Order of Service, Matins (p. 109)

“Matins”—from the Latin word for “morning”—is one of the main services the monks would sing together each day during the middle ages. The Lutheran church kept the Matins liturgy because its focus is on the reading and hearing of God’s Word. In this early morning hour, we rejoice to hear God’s Word proclaim to us the Good News that “He Is Risen!”

Therefore I am informing you that no one speaking by God's Spirit says, "A curse be upon Jesus," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are various kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of ministries, and yet the same Lord. There are various kinds of activity, but the same God, who produces all of them in everyone. Each person is given a manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one person a message of wisdom is given by the Spirit; to another, a message of knowledge, as the same Spirit provides it; by the same Spirit, faith is given to someone else; and to another, the same Spirit gives healing gifts. FROM THE DEACONS TO THE MEN OF OUR CONGREGATION: USHERING AT MT. OLIVE

Dear Brothers in Christ: The task of ushering is vital to the worship life of our congregation, and we need your assistance with it! As we were making our way back from the pandemic, we had asked for volunteers to sign up to usher at one of our two services for a month of the year. We thank those who answered our request and ushered for us in these past months! As we've worked with smaller ushering crews, we have worked toward a more efficient ushering practice, and we realize that our ushering crews no longer need to be as large as they once were (especially with our current format for gathering our offerings). At this time, our Deacons have decided that we should **return to using a regular "usher rotation,"** where we assign the willing, confirmed men of our congregation to usher at one of the two Sunday morning Services for a month-long period. As in previous years, the ushering assignments will move back one month every year (i.e. those ushering in December 2021 will usher in November of 2022—so a single usher crew is not stuck each year with a particular busy month or season). As in the past, if there is a conflict that you have, or if you are unable to usher for that time period, we ask that you seek to find a replacement usher. We can assist by providing you with an "Alternate List" of men that you can contact and see if they are able to fill-in for you. If you **do not see your name on the list and would like to serve as an Usher**, please contact our Deacon in charge of ushering, Matthias Leyrer (contact info below). He will gladly add you to a month, and can make adjustments for future years. Those men who might be **new members, or are newly confirmed**, please let us know if you are interested in serving your congregation as an usher. **We would love to get you involved** in serving at Mt. Olive!

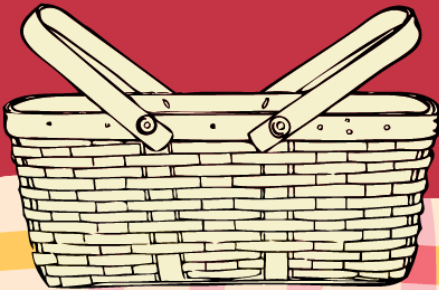
