Welcome! In the name of our risen Savior, we welcome you to Mt. Olive and thank you for worshipping with us. If you are a guest, please fill out a "Get Connected!" card (On the Welcome table and in front of you in the pew). We invite you to come and worship with us again soon.

Explanation of the Week:

"There are three that bear witness on earth: the Spirit, the water, and the blood." (1 John 5:4-10) These three point to Christ and flow from Christ. Jesus shows His disciples His hands and the side from which blood and water flowed, saying "Peace be with you." He presents the wounds which turn our fear to gladness, which restore us to the Father. Jesus breathes on His disciples and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:19-31) This Spirit and the faith that He works in our hearts enables us to now stand up with Job, even in the face of great hardship and tragedy, and proclaim that our "Redeemer lives!" And because of that, we will also stand with Him on the glorious day of resurrection. (Job 19:25-27) This is the faith and hope that our 8th Grade Confirmation Class is publicly professing today, on Confirmation Sunday (taking place during our 2nd Service). We give our confirmands the opportunity to affirm the faith that they were baptized into, making a solemn vow to remain true to God's Word throughout their lives. Having been taught the truths of the Christian faith, having demonstrated their knowledge of these truths (at Thursday evening's Public Examination), they are now ready to receive the Lord's Supper, and to continue on in the church as mature Christian individuals. We keep them and all our young people in our prayers!

About Today's Order of Service: Matins (ELH p. 109)

"Matins"—from the Latin word for "morning"—is one of the main services the monks would sing together each day during the middle ages. The Lutheran church kept the Matins liturgy because its focus is on the reading and hearing of God's Word. In this early morning hour, we rejoice to hear God's Word proclaim to us the Good News that "He Is Risen!"

~Old Testament Lesson

Job 19:25-27 I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!

~Epistle Lesson

1 John 5:4-12 Everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world: our faith. Who is the one who overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.

This is the one who came by water and blood: Jesus Christ. He did not come by the water alone but by the water and by the blood. The Spirit is the one who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. In fact, there are three that testify: the Spirit, the water, and the blood, and these three are one.

If we accept the testimony of people, God's testimony is even greater, because it is the testimony that God gave about his Son. The one who believes in the Son of God has this testimony in him, but the one who does not believe has made God out to be a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God gave about his Son. This is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. The one who has the Son has life. The one who does not have the Son of God does not have life.

~Holy Gospel Lesson & Sermon Text

Luke 24:36-49 While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate it in their presence.

He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send

you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."




