Explanation of the Week: *Our Lord wept over Jerusalem for the destruction that would soon come upon her. For she did not recognize the time of God's visitation in Christ, who had come to bring her peace (Luke 19:41-48). Through His prophets God had consistently called His people to turn from their deceit and false worship. "But My people do not know the judgment of the Lord" (Jer 7:1-11; 8:4-12). By the Holy Spirit, He works in His people renewed obedience and courage so that by His power we speak and confess and persist in faithful and joyful obedience to Him (Acts 4:5-20).*

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and

~Holy Gospel Lesson

(EHV) (ELH p. 67)

P: The Holy Gospel for the 10th Sunday after Trinity is written in the 19th chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke, beginning at the 41st verse.

C: ♪ Glory be to You, O Lord!

Luke 19:41-48 As he came near, he saw the city and wept over it. He said, "If you, yes you, had only known on this day the things that would bring peace to you. But now, it is hidden from your eyes. In fact, the days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you, surround you, and hem you in on every side. Within your walls, they will dash you and your children to the ground. And within your walls, they will not leave one stone on top of another, because you did not recognize the time when God came to help you." Jesus entered the temple courts and began to drive out those who were selling things there. He told them, "It is written, 'My house will be a house of prayer,' but you have made it a 'den of robbers!'" Every day he was teaching in the temple courts, but the chief priests, the experts in the law, and the leaders of the people continued to look for a way to put him to death. They could not find any way to do it, because all the people were clinging to him and listening.

P: This is the Holy Gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

~Sermon Text

(EHV)

Acts 4:13-20 When they saw the boldness of Peter and John and found out that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were astonished and took note of the fact that these men had been with Jesus. But since they saw the man who had been healed standing there with them, they could not say anything in reply. After they had ordered them to leave the Sanhedrin, they discussed the matter among themselves. They asked, "What should we do with these men? To be sure, it is evident to all who live in Jerusalem that a miraculous sign has been done through them, and we cannot deny it. However, in order that this may spread no further among the people, let us give them a strict warning not to speak any longer to anyone in this name." Then they summoned them and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. But Peter and John answered them, "Decide whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God. For we cannot stop speaking about what we have seen and heard."

III. The Service of Holy Communion



(Following Christ's command, we receive His grace to us in the special meal He instituted for the forgiveness of our sins. Here, He feeds with His true body and His true blood in, with, and under the bread and wine. This is the same body which was born of the Virgin Mary, and the same blood which dripped down the wooden cross. This part of the liturgy is one of the oldest parts, dating back to at least the third century AD.)

Questions and prayers to assist in preparing for the Lord's Supper are found in the black hymnal pp. 38-40.)

- **Guests & Visitors:** *We practice "Close" or "Closed Communion" (or "Membership Communion"). We do this out of love and concern for you. We want to make sure that those who take this holy meal receive it as a blessing and not to their harm as Scripture warns. We also understand that those who come forward to take communion are professing a unity of faith with our congregation and are in full agreement with the teachings and doctrines of Mount Olive Lutheran Church and of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod. Therefore, we ask those who have not taken Holy Communion with us before to speak with a pastor before communing. Thank you.*
